Director-General,
World Health Organization**

Dr. Margaret Chan has dedicated her career to preventing the spread of disease and promoting better health. A former WHO assistant director-general for communicable diseases, she also served a nine-year term as director of health in Hong Kong, confronting H5N1 avian influenza and effectively managing the SARS outbreak. She is a world leader in fostering health security and implementing improved health practices among disadvantaged and vulnerable groups with little political voice. Representing one of Rotary's partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, she will present an update on the continuing struggle to eradicate the wild poliovirus in the remaining polio-endemic countries.

Co-Director, AIDS-Free World**

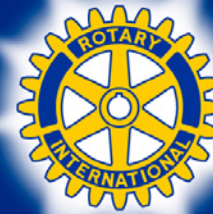
Stephen Lewis is the co-director of AIDS-Free World, an advocacy organization that grew out of his conviction that the AIDS pandemic can be defeated with better leadership and more urgent and effective responses from the UN, wealthy

nations, and the governments of the most affected countries. He was the United Nations special envoy for HIV/AIDS in Africa from 2001 to 2006. His extensive career in the fields of diplomacy, politics, activism, and humanitarian work includes roles as deputy executive director of UNICEF and Canadian ambassador to the UN.
