Mats Ingemanson will speak about Paul Harris' exciting youth, including his 5 restless years after law school when he traveled to different places in America and Europe and worked as a reporter, laborer, teacher, actor, traveling salesman, cowboy and cattleman. You will also hear Paul Harris speak from a recording that he made in 1933. Mats Ingemanson's presentation, in combination with Paul Harris' own speech, explains in vivid ways how Paul Harris inspired the creation and growth of Rotary to become the most prominent service organization in the world today. It gives Paul Harris a youthful image that is more likely to inspire young professionals to join Rotary. It may surprise you that Paul Harris was only 37 years old when Rotary was founded in 1905 and only 42 years old when he became President of the National Association of Rotary Clubs, which later was re-named to Rotary International.

Even though Mats Ingemanson is mostly known in Rotary for the weekly New York Rotary E-Mail Newsletter and the New York Rotary Website, he is also a founding member of Rotary's Global History Fellowship and serves in its Executive Committee as Senior Vice President and History Ambassador. Mats came to America from Sweden 23 years ago with a grant from the Swedish Government to develop a personal computer in Berkeley, CA. He has been an entrepreneur for many years doing business in America, Europe and Asia. His company sold and installed the first Chinese word processing system at the United Nations and maintained it for 10 years. Mats is also an inventor with pending and issued patents.
